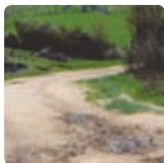
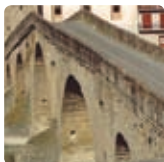
Saint Francis of Assisi

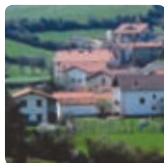


Dr Karl Kruszelnicki of the ABC

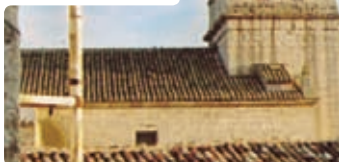


Hape Kerkeling – famous German television presenter and comedian (atheist, gay with a very high media presence throughout the German speaking world)
